
For any planned absences (sporting fixtures, university visits, etc) please could the <u>Leave of Absence</u> Form be completed in advance.

Note: School aged children cannot receive this vaccination with their GP unless they are clinically vulnerable.

Year 7 Music scholarships

Year 7 students have the opportunity to apply for a music scholarship in 25/26. This google form is to register your interest in becoming a **Music Scholar** for **2026**. Opportunities are available to learn the trumpet or trombone for 12 year 7's who will receive a free instrument and twenty 30 minute lessons on the trumpet or trombone.

The scholarship offers free weekly lessons on a brass instrument of your choice for 2 terms (during school hours), an instrument to borrow and take home to practice with and performance opportunities. All we ask in return is that they need to practise every week, attend their lessons regularly, on time. Lessons will take place in groups of 3. In Term 2, you will join the music club on your instrument (Orchestra or Brass Club) and attend weekly.
